In person on upper parking lot

In car lower parking lot

- You will be able to hear the entire service through your car radio using our short wave frequency.
- For communion, bring your own elements. As communion is distributed, a masked assisting minister will come to your car and pronounce the blessing. They are also able to receive your offering.
